1789 Don't Judge the Jury (Passed 19 Nov 15)

Proposer: Yan Malinowski (UEA Model UN)

Seconder: Jo Swo (Welfare, Community & Diversity Officer)

Union Notes:

1) That any person over 18 who is on the electoral register may be selected to perform Jury Service.

2) That in a democracy, Jury Service is one of the ways in which citizens have a major impact on their community

3) For students, proof of class attendance or examination is required in order to be excused from Jury Service.

4) A small number of UEA students have been and will continue to be called for Jury Service.

5) That there are no University or Union resources advising students on what to do if they are called for Jury Service.

Union Believes:

1) That recent efforts to increase the number of students registered to vote will have inadvertently increased the number of students eligible for Jury Service.

2) That information on how students can apply for excusal is hard to come by.

3) That this lack of information can result in students being mandated to attend Jury Service without realising they could have opted out.

4) Students should have adequate advice when called for Jury Service, and have support from the Union so they can choose whether to apply for excusal or carry out their service.

5) That the pressures of Jury Service can impact the mental health and wellbeing

of students.

6) That Jury Service can take students from classes for multiple weeks and that this can impact their educational attainment, regardless of whether or not they have exams.

7) That the University must show understanding to students requesting leave

of absence to perform Jury Service.

Union Resolves:

1) To mandate the Welfare, Community & Diversity Officer to produce materials that will advise students on what they can do if they are called for Jury Service.

2) To ensure that this information is easily accessible, on the Union website, upon request in Union House and through the Advice Service.

3) To ensure that students know of the existence of this information, by producing leaflets that raise awareness to the issue of Jury Service.

4) To lobby the University:

a) To ensure students choosing to apply for excusal get the proof they need for their application swiftly and without obstacle.

b) To ensure that students who attend their Jury Service are given the necessary leave of absence.
